Safeguarding Sunday

The weekend, at the end of National Child Protection Week, the Catholic Church in Australia marks Safeguarding Sunday. The purpose of this day is threefold, namely to:

- acknowledge the immense damage caused by the sexual abuse of children and adults at risk, including by priests, religious and lay people within Catholic contexts
- commit to practices and protocols that create and maintain safe environments for all people
- pray for those harmed by abuse, both directly and indirectly

Abuse within the Church is not a one-off historical event that happened in some off place. It has occurred throughout the history of the Church, and will occur again; we need to be vigilant and aware so that risks are minimised. Sadly, there has been extensive abuse within the short history of our Diocese.

Today we pause to focus on our responsibility to protect and care for those who are vulnerable. In the Bible, we find a clear and strong message about justice, compassion, and speaking up for those who cannot speak for themselves. We are called to be a safe, welcoming and hope-filled church. In our everyday lives, let's be mindful of those around us who are vulnerable or marginalised. Who are the "silent" ones in our society, the ones without a voice? Today, God may be calling you to stand up for them. Whether it's through prayer, support, or direct action, we are invited to participate in God's work of justice.

The Catholic Diocese of Rockhampton abides by the principles of the **National Catholic Safeguarding Standards** (2022), and is committed to safeguarding, with a specific focus on protecting children and adults at risk.

Caritas Australia invites parishioners to stand in solidarity with vulnerable communities in need of sustainable development and ecological renewal by:


